Our principal guides on the way are the great storytellers of the Old Testament, the dynamic and provocative preacher Paul, and above all Jesus himself via the evangelists Luke and John. Today's ensemble of readings invites us into the grand sweep of God's saving work in our human history from an early creed recalling the exodus, through the earthly mission of Jesus, to the salvation we experience by confessing our faith. The time has come to turn around and believe the Good News; the reign of God is at hand.
