Readings: Acts 3:13-15,17-19; Psalm 4; John 2:1-5; Luke 24: 35-48 **Psalm Response:** Lord let your face shine on us.

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

To preach repentance for the forgiveness of sins is what the risen Lord commissions the disciples to do (Lk 24:27). Repentance might strike us as a Lenten, rather than an Easter, concern. A quick glance through a standard collection of Easter hymns reveals common themes like triumph, joy, light, glory, eternal life and feasting, and only occasional references to pardon from sin. It's worth turning our minds back to what many of us heard as we were marked on Ash Wednesday: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." This brief injunction suggests that repentance is choosing to let go of all that hinders our embrace of the good news. It is a perennial summons to come forth from the grave of our self-obsession, and live.
